| DT | Optional - Design an Outdoor Play Park with activities and rides to suit children from the age of 4 to 15 More detailed instructions for this task can be found under 'Home Learning' on the school website. Think about play parks you already know such as the one at Sanders Park and others you may know. Unlike larger theme parks, these smaller play parks are free for everyone to use. They are not supervised, so they have been planned with the safety of the user very much in mind. The Task Your park design should be a 'plan' view, this means looking down from the top. Use A4 plain paper or A3 paper if you are lucky enough to have it. Draw your play park plan carefully using a ruler and pencil for straight lines and a compass or round object to draw around for circles. | |
| History | Using your work from the last few months on the: Magna Carta, Peasants revolt, Spanish Armada, The Gunpowder plot and the Battle of Waterloo, you will create a poster explaining which event you think was the most significant. Your poster should have the title 'The most significant event between 1215 and 1815'. You must decide which of the 4 events above you think is most important and be clear on your reasons why. You could refer to the 5R's (Remarkable = people have talked about it, Resonant = it connects with people's lives today, resulting in change = it has had consequences for the future, revealing = it tells us something about that time period, remembered = it stays in people's memory) See Epraise for additional tasks set by your teacher. | |
