

- Hair tied back
- Use Sewing Machine Correctly as you have been shown and always be aware of the position of your fingers in relation to the pressure foot and needle.

How to use the sewing machine

- > Line the fabric up carefully under the pressure foot.
- Put the pressure foot lever down.
- Move the balance wheel to pierce the fabric with the needle.
- Slowly push the foot pedal down.
- Guide the fabric keeping it straight as the machine as the machine moves it at an even pace.

Making you Phone Case
