
Skills - Measuring, Marking and Cutting out fabric. Using Templates and sewing fabric pieces together.





Cut out the template(s) that you have designed for your cushion.

Use your template(s) to cut out the fabric in your chosen colours.

Pin your fabric shapes to the main outer wall of your cushion.









Sew your fabric shapes using the range of stitches you have learnt.

Sew the two sides of your cushion together leaving a 1cm margin and a 12cm gap to insert the stuffing.

Insert enough stuffing, but do not over-fill your cushion, or it will be too hard to rest your head on!
