





Time Signatures: Tell you how many beats are in each bar (the top number) and what sort of beats they are (the bottom number). For example:

4 beats per bar

4 on the bottom means we are counting crotchets (Ta)

TERM	DEFINITION
Staff/Stave	The five lines the music is notated on _____
Treble Clef	This symbol at the start of the staff indicates that the notes of the lines are (lowest to highest) E G B D F and the notes of the spaces are F A C E 
Barline	These vertical lines split up the staff into groups of beats (the number of beats in each group or 'bar' is determined by the time signature)

NOTES OF THE TREBLE STAFF

FINDING THE NOTES

The black keys are grouped as follows:

2 3 2 3 etc...

Find any group of 2 black keys: we call this the **KENNEL**



The Dog (the note D) lives in the kennel! - So the white note between the two black notes is always D.

Because the notes are in alphabetical order (from A, B, C, D, E, F, G (and repeat) once we can find D - we can find all the other notes!
It's simple! 😊
