
What makes up the UK?

Who lives in the UK?




The population of the UK is made up of a real mix of people from all kinds of different backgrounds. An **immigrant** is a person who moves to a country to live. 20,000 years ago nobody lived in the UK, most of it was covered in ice.

The groups of people coming to the UK has been varied! Some of the main groups have been; the original hunter gatherer settlers after the ice age had ended, the Romans, Irish settlers escaping the famine, Jews escaping persecution, people from the Caribbean, and economic migrants from the EU.

Weather and Climate in the UK

Weather is the day to day conditions of the atmosphere – e.g. sunny, cloudy
