Request for leave during term time

We kindly ask that all parents support in ensuring that any holidays are not taken during the school term. There are 175 non-school days every year to take holidays and arrange other family events and activities.

Evidence shows that pupils with good school attendance enjoy better wellbeing and school performance.

During the final weeks of this term, we have some exciting trips, visits, and activities planned for our students to enjoy with their friends. These include Funfest and Lakeside, and as well as house competitions, we're gearing up to celebrate their successes and achievements throughout the year. Therefore, we kindly ask that you refrain from booking holidays during term time, as we believe it's important for our entire school community to participate in these memorable activities.

There are only a very few circumstances where a child can miss school, such as illness or where leave has been permitted because of exceptional circumstances.

Parents are reminded that leave of absence taken without permission during term time may result in the issue of a penalty notice by the Local Authority. Money raised via fines is only used by the local authority to cover the costs of administering the system, and to fund attendance support. Any extra money is returned to the government.

Rewarding Attendance

As we dive into the Summer term, we're excited to announce an opportunity for our dedicated students to be rewarded for their outstanding attendance.

We believe that consistent attendance is key to academic success and overall well-being, and we're eager to celebrate those who have demonstrated exceptional commitment to their education.

We're pleased to offer some fantastic prizes for students with excellent attendance records. Every pupil with attendance over 96% will be entered into a prize draw to win a delightful Easter Egg. In addition to the Easter Egg, three lucky winners will also receive a £10 Amazon gift voucher. Those with 100% attendance will receive additional entries. If your attendance doesn't quite meet the 96% threshold at the moment, there's no need to worry. We'll only be counting attendance after the Easter holidays, giving everyone a fresh chance to qualify for these exciting prizes. Remember, all pupils with 100% attendance in a half term receive 100 house points and those with attendance over 96% receive 75 house points, and we know you are all saving up for your Funfest tickets and extra time!

Uniform and Equipment reminders

As we approach the final term of the academic year, we'd like to remind you of the importance of upholding our high uniform standards until the end of term. While we understand that pupils may experience growth spurts, it remains crucial that every child adheres to the correct uniform and school shoe requirements throughout the term.

With the Easter holidays approaching, now is a good time to assess your child's uniform and school shoes. If replacements are needed, we encourage you to use this break to ensure your child has the appropriate attire for the remainder of the term.

You may also wish to check that your child has all the equipment they need to complete their school work. Here is a list of our equipment list to help you.

Failure to have these essential items every day will result in teachers issuing pupils with a D1 in line with our behaviour policy. Were pupils consistently do not have what they need consequences will be escalated.

Mock Trial

On Saturday 16th March our Mock Trial team took part in the Worcestershire and Herefordshire heat of the national competition at Worcester Magistrates' Court. This competition is open to Year 8 and Year 9 pupils and we have been practising weekly since October. Our team had to prosecute and defend a case of alleged assault causing actual bodily harm. It centred on a dispute between a taxi driver, Chris Wheeler and their customer, Jo Goodwin. We studied the case and spent time drafting and redrafting our speeches, questions for witnesses and possible answers. We also spent time learning the roles of different people in a court room (including lawyers, ushers, magistrates, legal advisers and witnesses).

On the day of the competition we saw that there were eleven schools taking part (including only one other middle school). We prosecuted the case against a team from Nunnery Wood High School and defended against a team from Droitwich Spa High School. We won both our rounds. We developed our confidence and many skills in this process and most importantly enjoyed the experience.

Ten year 7 and 8 pupils joined in with the workshops afterschool.


